Things to know about *stimulus payments* during the COVID-19 pandemic.

1 The government will send electronic deposits or paper checks of \$1,200 to individuals or \$2,400 to married couples, plus up to \$500 for each child under age 17.

2 You are eligible for the full payment amount if your adjusted gross income is below \$75,000 as an individual or below \$150,000 as a married couple.

3 You will not need to take any action if you receive Social Security retirement benefits or Social Security Disability Insurance (SSDI) benefits. Your stimulus checks will be sent the same way that you receive those payments.

4 Stay tuned! We are waiting on further guidance from IRS for those who normally do not file a tax return, including those on SSI and receiving VA disability benefits. The IRS may also place a link on its website to input your bank information so you do not have to wait for a paper check.

5 The stimulus check money is available through the rest of 2020. We regularly help with these kinds of cases at the Legal Aid Society, so please feel free to call (502) 584-1254.
